

Food Service Management: Sale of Food Items

A. State Board Regulation

The sale of food items in school during the lunch period shall be limited to those items recognized as being components of the school lunch program's Type A lunch and breakfast; and the income from the sale of those items shall accrue to the school lunch account.

The following provisions shall apply in implementing this regulation:

1. "Food items" covers both food and drink.
2. "Lunch period" is the time from the beginning of the first lunch period through the end of the last lunch period.
3. This regulation does not prohibit the sale of a la carte items. It does limit the a la carte items to those which can be served as part of the part of the Type A lunch and breakfast such as sandwiches, soup, salads, fruit, juice, desserts, and chocolate milk. A review of the past Type A menus will provide guidance for a la carte items.
4. All income from sale of food items during the lunch period in the lunchroom or other locations in the building shall accrue to the school lunch account.
5. It is strongly recommended that food items sold in high school at times other than the lunch period be of recognized nutritional value.

B. School Division Regulation

These items cannot be sold to students on school premises (all areas of the school) from the beginning of the school day until after the close of the last class period:

1. Chewing gum
2. Certain Candies
 - (a) Hard Candy
 - (b) Jellies and Gum Candies
 - (c) Marshmallow Candies
 - (d) Fondant
 - (e) Licorice
 - (f) Spun Candy
 - (g) Candy Coated Popcorn
3. Water Ices
